EFL Community Center



The community center at El Franco Lee Park, 9400 Hall Road (Key Map 575Z) is nearing completion. With most of the exterior work done — the exterior paving is complete and the exterior glass installation ongoing — the focus is continuing with the interiors. The kitchen area has been roughed-in with the delivery of the kitchen equipment on its way.

The approximately 10,705 GSF building will consist of a large multi-purpose room, kitchen, arts & crafts room, exercise room, staff offices and restrooms. Estimated completion date: 2nd Quarter 2008.

New Hike and Bike Trail

Precinct One has entered into an interlocal agreement with Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) regarding HCFCD Unit D518-02-00 (Key Map 530W) in the vicinity of Westbrae near South Gessner. The Precinct will construct a 6-foot wide public hike and bike trail with related appurtenances along each side of the Unit. — the Unit consists of six detention ponds. Also, a trail will be constructed around the perimeters of each of the ponds in phases over a period of one year, beginning in April 2008. The new trail of six sections will total approximately 1.30 miles in length, and will be maintained by the Precinct.

With the addition of the new trail, the total miles of existing trails under the maintenance of Precinct One is approximately 29.15 miles.

Note from the Commissioner



Again the end of the year concluded on a high note with the Precinct's highly successful Seniors Holiday Celebration at Reliant Center — with over 2,800 senior revelers. The energy from the various activities makes one forget that the revelers are senior citizens. In addition to enjoying the fellowship — food and music, the revelers did not forget others that were not as fortunate by bringing canned goods for the Houston Food Bank. Special thanks to Commissioners Sylvia Garcia, Steve Radack, Jerry Eversole and their employees for assisting in providing transportation to and from the event.

Several major events will take place during the first two quarters of the new year. Within the first half of 2008, the Precinct will have at least three major new structure openings — the Community Center at El Franco Lee Park, the Aquatics Center on El Camino, and the new Hardy Service Center. All of the facilities are being greeted with great anticipation.

Historically, the month of February is recognized as *Black History Month*, wherein millions of Americans pause and reflect on the many and varied contributions Black Americans have made to this Country, and to the World, but exchanges need to continue throughout the year and among all ethnic and cultural groups. An appreciation of diversity enables all of us to work together for a stronger and better America.

The March primary elections revealed Texans' pivotal role in the election process. The primaries were conducted by the political party county chairs and administered by the county clerk. A reminder that the primary runoff election date is April 8, 2008, with early voting beginning March 31 and ending April 4, 2008. Excavation for construction of the Challenger Seven Nature Center began in February 2008; estimated completion date: end of the 3rd Quarter 2008 ►

The new addition to the Learning Center will measure 41'x 27' and will consist of 1100 sq. ft. The dedicated edifice will house an animal lab as well as bird cages for non-releasable birds, and turtle pens to house program animals.

Proposed Dog Parks in Design Phase

The creation of a dog park in Precinct One is moving closer to being a reality. The Precinct will develop two dog parks — one at Tom Bass Park in the southern region of the Precinct and the other at Alexander Deussen Park in the northern region — both proposed parks are presently in the design phase.

In concept, a dog park is a fenced in area where dogs are allowed to run off leash under the supervision of their owners. Separate areas are provided for dogs under 20 pounds and another area for larger dogs. Both areas will be equipped with water fountains and some doggy-type play structures such as ramps and tunnels; there will be trails, benches and shade structures (if needed) for their owners.

A wash down station outside the main gate will be provided to hose down muddy paws.

Household Hazardous Waste

ONE-DAY COLLECTION EVENT

Saturday, April 26, 2008

Hardy Service Center • 11801 West Hardy (Key Map 413Q) • Houston, TX 77076 • 8 AM to 2 PM only

Precinct One will host a one-day drop-off event for Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) on Saturday, April 26th at the new Hardy Service Center. Each year the county holds approximately ten (10) such one-day collection events throughout the county. The events are typically held during the spring and fall season, and are free to all residents of Harris County.

Residents may bring household quantities of paint products, pesticides, fertilizers, motor oil, gasoline, pool chemicals, household cleaners, aerosols, batteries and five automotive tires, per household.

Used electronics such as televisions, computers, word processors, printers, scanners, fax machines, cellular phones, VCRs, stereos and other small personal electronics are also accepted. Residents may bring up to five (5) of each of these items.

A mercury thermometer exchange will be held in conjunction with each of the events. Residents may bring a mercury fever thermometer for proper disposal and receive a FREE, non-toxic replacement.

In addition to the collections, participants will receive information on less toxic alternatives to common hazardous household products and can also shop for FREE items at the reusable products booth located near the exit of the drop-off site.

Products such as business waste, medical waste, ammunition, explosives, compressed gas cylinders, washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, photocopy machines, microwaves, or smoke detectors are NOT accepted at these events. Businesses may call the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Small Business and Local Government Assistance Hotline (800.447.2827) for information on proper disposal methods for hazardous waste. The hotline offers free, confidential technical assistance.

Brays Bayou Flood Damage Reduction Project

The Brays Bayou Flood Damage Reduction Project (Project Brays) is under way. Project Brays, a cooperative effort between the Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, is designed to benefit thousands of residents and businesses by reducing the risk of flooding along the entire channel from Hwy 6 to the mouth of the ship channel. HCFCD utilizes a combination of several tools to address the flooding risk along Brays Bayou, including channel and bridge modifications, and storm detention basins.

Commissioner Lee states area residents will soon benefit from two miles of channel modifications underway by the HCFCD in the Third Ward Community from Ardmore to Calhoun.

This phase of the project, a 330 calendar day contract commenced in June 2007 and is expected to be completed in May 2008. The project cost is \$5.9m and includes the following: excavation of approximately 328,400 cubic yards of material with off-site disposal, construction of maintenance access ramps and trails, and replacement of two miles of Hike & Bike trails. Other improvements will include a new backslope drainage system, swales, interceptor structures, pipe and headwall outfall protection, retaining walls, and replacing displaced storm sewers to enhance drainage in the area.

Future project work within Precinct One on the Brays Bayou Watershed will include additional channel and bridge modifications from Old Spanish Trail to Stella Link.
